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WOMEN EMPOWERMENT AND REVITALIZATION OF TRADITION

The initiative is focused on the production of traditional handmade products in loom, by the women of Dibra. The area offers limited employment opportunities to woman, thus, the establishment of "Tradite Dibrane" shop contributes to this regard, enabling women economic empowerment, socializing with other women in the area, and the financial sustainability of the social enterprise.

Main results of the action:

- Equipment of the workshop with a new loom, sewing machine, raw materials diversifying the range of products (scarves, pillowcs, table clothes, giit products, etc.);
- Employment of three women in the workshop and support of ten other women to sell their products at "Traditë Dibrane" shop;
- "Transfer our knowledge to young girls" - provision of on-job training in the workshop premises for other women and girls contributes to skill transfer and future employment of young generation.
